Absolute Asset Sold to PH Performance Horses LLC

Doniphan, Neb. -- Dan McWhirter Quarter Horses announces the sale of the stallion Absolute Asset to Kansas-based PH Performance Horses LLC, comprised of business managers John and Beth Pankratz, of Overbrook, and breeding managers Bill and Orlana Hurner, of Carbondale.

Absolute Asset's move to Kansas, is a good fit for the PH Performance Horses breeding operation. "He completes our breeding program." says Orlana Hurner. "After extensive research, we began breeding our mares to Absolute Asset two years ago, and we also acquired broodmares which have produced outstanding foals by him from the McWhirters to expand our broodmare band."

"We love this horse," emphasizes Beth Pankratz. "We are absolutely invested in the bloodline, which is why we were breeding to him the past two years."

Absolute Asset has the lineage to deliver on Pankratz' enthusiasm. His Absolute Bloodlines read like a who's who of the quarter horse industry. He is sired by Good Asset by Zippos Mr Goodbar by Zippo Pine Bar. His dam, Investment Ms, is by The Big Investment by the world-famous sire, The Investor. Absolute Asset shares his dam with the stallion, Absolute Investment.

The change in ownership evolved when the McWhirters learned the PH partners had decided to take a different direction with the young stallion they were developing. Carol McWhirter contacted the Hurners to see if they would be interested in joining in advancing the Absolute bloodlines by owning Absolute Asset. The PH partners all agree, "We are truly grateful to Dan and Carol McWhirter for the opportunity to own this outstanding stallion."

"Absolute Asset is a really special horse." says Carol McWhirter, describing the stallion as "one-of-a-kind, with unique characteristics." She goes on to say that over the last 25 years the Absolute Bloodline has produced quarter horses with correct conformation, great minds and exceptional movement.

“Most quarter horses grow one end at a time,” McWhirter explains, “and many are higher in the hip than the withers. Absolute Asset offspring mature with a level topline, which is truly the exception.”

According to McWhirter, Absolute Asset stamps his foals with balance, along with size, leggy good looks and wonderful dispositions to consistently produce winners in the show pen. “His offspring are just now making an impact in the show pen in western pleasure, hunter under saddle and other performance classes,” she points out, “as well as performance halter.”

McWhirter foresees an exciting career for Absolute Asset as a performance sire. Partnering with quarter horse breeders like the PH Performance Horses partners, who are passionate to exceed, McWhirter hopes “to create greater things together” with Absolute Bloodlines.
